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Executive Summary

Introduction

- The food and drink supply chain (FDSC) comprises four key industries¹; primary production, food and drink manufacturing, hospitality and retail. The FDSC is very important to the Welsh economy in terms of employment, income and the contribution it makes to tourism.
- The aim of this research project was to assess the supply and demand for vocational education and training across the supply chain on behalf of the four Sector Skills Councils (SSCs) (Lantra, Improve, Skillsmart Retail and People 1st) responsible for the FDSC. This research, which was funded through the Welsh Government's Sector Priorities Fund Pilot, marks the starting point for collaboration between SSCs by identifying emerging skills needs across the chain.
- The research is based on a representative sample of approximately 2,000 businesses across Wales which was collated through a large scale telephone survey and a series of qualitative interviews and workshops, which also included industry stakeholders, employers, learning providers and students.
- Firstly, this research considers current employers' perceptions of the demand for current and future skills needs in their businesses and secondly, this research identifies the current supply of training by considering levels of provision, methods and barriers. Consequently, suggestions for potential future actions are provided.

Overview

- The FDSC in Wales **employs approximately 230,000 people**, which accounts for 5.7% of the entire UK FDSC workforce.
- As a whole, the FDSC **makes up approximately 18% of the total Welsh workforce**. The FDSC in Wales generated approximately £6.5bn² of sales revenue in 2010, performing well despite the recession.
- By highlighting the importance of the FDSC to the Welsh economy and by establishing robust findings into the current and future skills needs of the FDSC, **the report aims to provide the consortia of SSCs with sufficient knowledge to be able to put in place the delivery mechanisms necessary to ensure the workforce has sufficient skills to drive the FDSC forward**.
- It is in recognition of the sector's important contribution to the economy of Wales that the Welsh Government have recently announced that food and farming is to be recognised as a priority sector in the Welsh Government Economic Renewal Policy.

Setting the scene

The FDSC in Wales employs approximately 230,000 people, which accounts for 5.7% of the entire UK FDSC workforce. As a whole, the FDSC makes up approximately 18% of the total Welsh workforce. The FDSC in Wales generated approximately £6.5bn³ of sales revenue in 2010, performing well despite the recession.

2011 research into the FDSC in Wales

- In all sectors there are skills gaps at a strategic business level, which have links with leadership and management. In many of the sectors – particularly so for primary production businesses, a need for better understanding of costs of production and pricing is necessary.
- The most important skills listed by businesses across the FDSC were: operating and maintaining equipment, waste awareness, environmental awareness and practice, sales and merchandising and manual handling. Food technology and handling raw materials were also included, as more specialist skills, in that they were ranked highly important, but for a smaller proportion of the workforce.
- Within individual sectors, sales and merchandising skills were especially important for retail, waste awareness and environmental awareness for retail and hospitality, and management of raw materials for hospitality and manufacturing. In the primary production sector, operating and maintaining equipment, and business and administration skills were particularly important. Analysis of future skills needs revealed that on the whole, sales and merchandising skills would be the most important over the next 3 years.
- In terms of skills gaps, 22% of survey respondents indicated that there had been an occasion when their workforce as a whole has not had the necessary skills to carry out the needs of the business. This equates to approximately 14,000 workers with skills deficiencies in the FDSC in Wales.
- Forty-five percent of businesses interviewed stated that there was a technical skills gap among their workforce, primarily relating to business, sales and merchandising skills, food technology and operating and maintaining equipment. Within individual sectors and cross-sector, skills gaps were primarily as follows:

Primary Production

- Business skills, such as:
 - Negotiating with contractors
 - Understanding your customer and products
 - Understanding costing and pricing
 - Understanding and taking part in basic accounting and record keeping.

- Sales and marketing skills such as:
 - Product presentation
 - Branding
 - Promotion and PR.
- Other key skill needs included operating and maintaining equipment and the need for information on the development of renewable energy.

Manufacturing

- Sales and merchandising / retail skills are becoming important – in particular understanding the customer and branding / marketing / retail presentation of products
- Food safety legislation is driving skills needs – in particular, food technologists are needed
- Business and management skills – in particular, process control skills such as lean management, stock control and the management of information
- Environmental awareness.

Hospitality

- Sales and merchandising skills are one of the sector's key skill needs – restaurateurs feel that selling the story behind the food and using local or seasonal goods are important to meet consumer demand
- Environmental awareness and waste awareness are also important skills
- People management is an essential skill for many hospitality providers.

Retail

- Sales and merchandising including:
 - Electronic point of sale (EPOS)
 - Online retailing and database management
 - Marketing awareness and pricing strategies
 - Retail presentation skills – for example product ranges, product displays and store layout.
- Environmental awareness and waste awareness are also important skills.

Cross-sector

- Analysis of technical skills needs revealed a degree of commonalities across the FDSC. In terms of general management skills, sales and merchandising featured as an important skill in each sector and in most cases, the underlying issue was a need for a better understanding of the market. A common link between the sectors was the promotion of 'sense of place' which is seen as an important aspect of both customer service and competitive advantage.
 - In terms of skills shortages, one quarter of respondents who recruited last year experienced a difficulty. The main reasons given were either that applicants did not have either the right attitude (42%) or the right skills (39%). The qualitative research supported these findings with many employers stating that employability skills, such as having the right attitude for work were lacking among applicants. This was particularly the case for employers in the hospitality sector.
 - Further comments received through qualitative fieldwork related to applicants not having sufficient communication skills or even more fundamentally, sufficient interpersonal skills at the most basic level. When employers are faced with skills shortages, the typical response is to try to train and develop existing staff, as evidenced by two thirds of survey respondents. Thus the issue of a skills shortage becomes one of a skills gap in the current workforce.
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Supply of training

In general, the FDSC suffers from poor career perceptions. Furthermore, the primary production and hospitality sectors are characterised by an ageing workforce and short term temporary labour respectively. The level of training varies greatly across the supply network, with some sectors suffering from widespread apathy towards training. These are fundamental issues that need to be addressed to ensure this important element of the Welsh economy has the workforce it needs to take it forward.

- In 2010, approximately 35,000 students were enrolled in FDSC related FE learning across Wales and a further 2,500 were enrolled in HE learning. During the qualitative research, numerous comments regarding the disjoint between industry needs and the FE sector were recorded. Several businesses commented that they felt the FE sector was not equipping students with the skills their business needed. A significant amount of training is known to take place in the FDSC through private providers although a detailed understanding of the extent of such training is largely unknown.
- The preferred method of training across the FDSC as a whole is 'on the job training with employers' and particularly so for semi and unskilled labour. Training with an external provider appears to be more suited to businesses in the primary production and manufacturing sectors. For the majority of businesses interviewed, the main reason for the preference of training was based on its cost and being able to minimise the loss of staff time.
- Across the FDSC as a whole, more than a third (37%) of all businesses stated that they are involved in some form of diversification or expansion activity which could mean expanding their product range / services, or becoming involved in new activities - for example diversifying into different sectors. This highlights that there is a high level of optimism and entrepreneurialism among businesses in the FDSC but as the report has also shown, a significant amount of skills are required to drive it forward.

Conclusions and Recommendations

- The FDSC is important to the Welsh economy, but it needs to add more value to compete with the rest of the UK. This will include taking advantage of the opportunities offered through a whole supply chain approach, considering where transferable skills exist and where joint initiatives on training and business development can either be identified from existing provision or through bespoke development.
- Ensuring that the Welsh workforce has the necessary skills to drive the FDSC forward is the responsibility of the SSCs and this research provides a robust evidence base from which they can develop strategies and secure the necessary funding needed to achieve this aim.

Considering the FDSC as a whole, there are two main sources of cross-sectoral skills needs:

- Where skills are common to more than one sector – for example, customer service, sales and merchandising or butchery skills
- Where individual businesses have diversified into another sector and so have developed additional skills needs as a result.

Based on the research findings set out in the Welsh Food & Drink Skills Project report, the following five key recommendations are suggested:

1. Raise awareness and develop understanding of cross-sectoral skills in the FDSC
 2. Increase the profile and understanding of the FDSC as a potential career
 3. Develop a greater understanding of non-accredited training
 4. Improve links between education and industry
 5. Enhance conditions which enable cross-sectoral business to take place

Crynodeb Gweithredol

Cyflwyniad

- Mae pedwar diwydiant allweddol yn rhan o'r gadwyn gyflenwi bwyd a diod (FDSC)¹; cynhyrchu cynradd, gweithgynhyrchu bwyd a diod, lletygarwch a manwerthu. Mae'r FDSC yn bwysig iawn i economi Cymru yn nhermau cyflogaeth, incwm a'r cyfraniad a wneir i dwristiaeth.
- Nod y prosiect ymchwil hwn oedd asesu'r cyflenwad a'r galw am hyfforddiant ac addysg alwedigaethol ar draws y gadwyn gyflenwi ar ran y pedwar Cyngor Sgiliau Sector (SSC) (Lantra, Improve, Skillsmart Retail a People 1st) sy'n gyfrifol am yr FDSC. Mae'r gwaith ymchwil hwn, a gafodd ei ariannu drwy Gynllun Peilot Cronfa Blaenoriaethau Sector Llywodraeth Cymru, yn nodi man cychwyn ar gyfer cydweithio rhwng yr SSCau trwy nodi anghenion sgiliau sy'n dod i'r golwg ar draws y gadwyn.
- Mae'r ymchwil yn seiliedig ar sampl gynrychioliadol o oddeutu 2,000 o fusnesau ar draws Cymru a gasglwyd ynghyd trwy gyfrwng arolwg ffôn ar raddfa fawr a chyfres o gyfweiliadau ansoddol a gweithdai, a oedd hefyd yn cynnwys rhanddeiliaid o'r diwydiant, cyflogwyr, darparwyr hyfforddiant a myfyrwyr.
- Yn gyntaf, mae'r ymchwil yn ystyried argraffiadau cyflogwyr cyfredol ynghylch y galw am anghenion sgiliau yn eu busnes, nawr ac yn y dyfodol, ac yn ail, mae'r ymchwil yn nodi'r cyflenwad hyfforddiant a geir ar hyn o bryd trwy ystyried lefelau'r ddarpariaeth, y dulliau a'r rhwystrau. O ganlyniad, rhoddir awgrymiadau ar gyfer camau gweithredu posib i'r dyfodol.

Trosolwg

- Cydnabyddiaeth o gyfraniad pwysig y sector i economi Cymru yw fod Llywodraeth Cymru wedi cyhoeddi'n ddiweddar y bydd bwyd a ffermio yn cael ei gydnabod yn sector blaenoriaeth ym Mholisi Adferiad Economaidd Llywodraeth Cymru.

Ymchwiliad 2011 i'r FDSC yng Nghymru

- Ym mhob sector mae bylchau sgiliau ar lefel fusnes strategol, sydd â chysylltiadau gydag arweinyddiaeth a rheolaeth. Mewn llawer o'r sectorau – yn enwedig felly ar gyfer busnesau cynhyrchu cynradd, y mae angen gwell dealltwriaeth o gostau cynhyrchu a phrisio.
- Y sgiliau mwyaf pwysig a restrwyd gan fusnesau ar draws yr FDSC oedd: gweithredu a chynnal cyfarpar, ymwybyddiaeth o wastraff, ymwybyddiaeth ac arferion amgylcheddol, gwerthu a masnachu a thrin â llaw. Cafodd technoleg bwyd a thrin deunyddiau crai eu cynnwys hefyd, fel sgiliau mwy arbenigol, o ran eu bod yn cael eu hystyried yn sgiliau pwysig iawn, ond bod hynny ar gyfer cyfran lai o'r gweithlu.
- O fewn sectorau unigol, roedd sgiliau gwerthu a masnachu yn hynod bwysig ar gyfer manwerthu, ymwybyddiaeth o wastraff ac ymwybyddiaeth amgylcheddol ar gyfer manwerthu a lletygarwch, a rheoli deunyddiau crai ar gyfer lletygarwch a gweithgynhyrchu. Yn y sector cynhyrchu cynradd, roedd gweithredu a chynnal cyfarpar, a sgiliau busnes a gweinyddu yn arbennig o bwysig. Wrth ddadansoddi anghenion sgiliau'r dyfodol gwelwyd mai sgiliau gwerthu a masnachu, ar y cyfan, fyddai'r mwyaf pwysig dros y tair blynedd nesaf.
- Yn nhermau bylchau sgiliau, nododd 22% o'r rhai a ymatebodd i'r arolwg y bu achlysur pryd y gwelwyd nad oedd y sgiliau angenrheidiol gan eu gweithlu yn ei gyfanrwydd er mwyn cyflawni anghenion y busnes. Mae hyn yn cyfateb yn fras i 14,000 o weithwyr gyda diffygion sgiliau yn yr FDSC yng Nghymru.
- Dywedodd pedwar deg pump y cant o'r busnesau a gafodd eu cyfweld fod bwllch sgiliau technegol ymysg eu gweithlu, yn bennaf yn ymwneud â sgiliau busnes, gwerthu a masnachu, technoleg bwyd a gweithredu a chynnal cyfarpar. O fewn sectorau unigol ac ar draws sectorau, dyma'r bylchau sgiliau pennaf:

- Sgiliau gwerthu a marchnata megis:
 - Cyflwyno cynnyrch
 - Brandio

- Ymhlith yr anghenion sgiliau allweddol eraill yr oedd gweithredu a chynnal cyfarpar a'r angen am wybodaeth ynghylch datblygu egni adnewyddadwy.

Gweithgynhyrchu

- Mae sgiliau gwerthu a masnachu / manwerthu yn dod yn bwysig – yn enwedig deall y cwsmer a brandio / marchnata / cyflwyno cynnyrch ar gyfer manwerthu
- Mae deddfwriaeth diogelwch bwyd yn gyrru'r angen am sgiliau – yn arbennig, mae angen technolegwyr bwyd
- Sgiliau busnes a rheoli – yn arbennig, sgiliau rheoli proses megis rheolaeth ddarbodus, rheoli stoc a rheoli gwybodaeth

Lletygarwch

- Sgiliau gwerthu a masnachu yw un o'r anghenion sgiliau allweddol yn y sector – mae perchnogion bwytai yn teimlo bod gwerthu'r stori y tu cefn i'r bwyd a defnyddio nwyddau lleol neu dymhorol yn bwysig er mwyn bodloni gofynion defnyddwyr
- Mae ymwybyddiaeth amgylcheddol ac ymwybyddiaeth o wastraff yn sgiliau pwysig hefyd
- Mae rheoli pobl yn sgil hanfodol i lawer o ddarparwyr lletygarwch.

Manwerthu

- Gwerthu a masnachu gan gynnwys:
 - Systemau electronig yn y man gwerthu (EPOS)
 - Rheoli cronfeydd data a manwerthu arlein
 - Ymwybyddiaeth o'r farchnad a strategaethau prisio
 - Sgiliau cyflwyno manwerthu – er enghraifft ystodau cynhyrchion, arddangos cynnyrch a gosodiad siopau.
- Mae ymwybyddiaeth amgylcheddol ac ymwybyddiaeth o wastraff yn sgiliau pwysig hefyd.

Traws-sector

- Wrth ddadansoddi'r anghenion sgiliau technegol, dangoswyd elfen sy'n gyffredin ar draws yr FDSC. O ran sgiliau rheoli cyffredinol, roedd gwerthu a masnachu yn ymddangos yn sgil pwysig ym mhob sector ac yn y rhan fwyaf o achosion, y mater wrth wraidd hyn oedd angen i fod â gwell dealltwriaeth o'r farchnad. Dolen gyffredin rhwng y sectorau oedd hyrwyddo 'synnwyr o le' a ystyrir yn agwedd bwysig ar y gwasanaeth i gwsmeriaid yn ogystal ag o ran mantais gystadleuol.
- O ran prinder sgiliau, nododd chwarter yr ymatebwyr a fu'n cyflogi y llynedd y cawsant anhawster wrth wneud hynny. Y prif resymau a roddwyd oedd naill ai nad oedd gan yr ymgeiswyr ddim mo'r agwedd gywir (42%) neu'r sgiliau cywir (39%). Roedd yr ymchwil ansoddol yn cefnogi'r casgliadau hyn gyda llawer o gyflogwyr yn dweud bod diffyg sgiliau cyflogadwyedd ymysg ymgeiswyr, megis bod â'r agwedd gywir at waith. Roedd hyn yn arbennig o wir ar gyfer cyflogwyr yn yr sector lletygarwch.
- Roedd sylwadau pellach a gasglwyd trwy waith maes ansoddol yn ymwneud ag ymgeiswyr heb sgiliau cyfathrebu digonol neu hyd yn oed yn fwy sylfaenol, heb ddigon o sgiliau rhyngpersonol ar y lefel fwyaf sylfaenol. Pan fydd cyflogwyr yn wynebu prinder sgiliau, yr ymateb nodweddiadol yw ceisio hyfforddi a datblygu staff presennol, fel y nododd dau draean o'r ymatebwyr i'r arolwg. Felly mae mater prinder sgiliau yn troi'n fater o fwch sgiliau yn y gweithlu cyfredol.

Cyflenwi hyfforddiant

Yn gyffredinol mae argraffiadau pobl yn wael o ran yr FDSC a gyrfaoedd. At hynny, mae'r sectorau cynhyrchu cynradd a lletygarwch yn cael eu nodweddu gan weithlu sy'n mynd yn hŷn a llafur dros dro tymor byr, yn y drefn honno. Mae lefel yr hyfforddiant yn amrywio'n fawr ar draws y gadwyn gyflenwi, gyda rhai sectorau'n dioddef oherwydd difaterwch cyffredin tuag at hyfforddiant. Mae'r rhain yn faterion sylfaenol y mae angen rhoi sylw iddynt er mwyn sicrhau bod yr elfen bwysig hon o'r economi Gymreig â'r gweithlu angenrheidiol er mwyn bwrw ymlaen i'r dyfodol.

- Yn 2010, roedd oddeutu 35,000 o fyfyrwyr wedi cofrestru ar gyrsiau Addysg Bellach (AB) yn gysylltiedig â'r FDSC ledled Cymru a 2,500 arall wedi cofrestru mewn Addysg Uwch. Yn ystod yr ymchwil ansoddol, cofnodwyd sylwadau niferus ynghylch y datgysylltiad rhwng anghenion y diwydiant a'r sector AB. Dywedodd nifer o fusnesau eu bod yn teimlo nad oedd y sector AB yn arfogi myfyrwyr gyda'r sgiliau oedd yn angenrheidiol ar gyfer eu busnes. Mae'n hysbys fod swm sylweddol o hyfforddiant yn digwydd yn yr FDSC trwy ddarparwyr preifat er nad oes ddealltwriaeth fanwl o hyd a lled hyfforddiant o'r fath.
- Y dull hyfforddi a ffeirir ledled yr FDSC gyfan yw 'hyfforddiant wrth y gwaith gyda chyflogwyr' ac yn enwedig felly ar gyfer gweithwyr di-grefft a lled-grefftus. Mae'n ymddangos fod hyfforddiant gyda darparwr allanol yn fwy addas ar gyfer busnesau yn y sectorau cynhyrchu cynradd a gweithgynhyrchu. I'r mwyafrif o fusnesau a gafodd eu cyfweild, y prif reswm dros ffafrio hyfforddiant penodol oedd ei gost a'r gallu i golli cyn lleied â phosib o amser y staff.
- Ar draws yr FDSC yn ei chyfanrwydd, dywedodd rhagor na thraean (37%) o'r holl fusnesau eu bod yn ymwneud â rhyw fath o arallgyfeirio neu weithgarwch ehangu a allai olygu ehangu eu hamrediad o gynhyrchion / gwasanaethau, neu ddod yn rhan o weithgareddau newydd – er enghraifft arallgyfeirio i sectorau gwahanol. Mae hyn yn amlygu fod yna lefel uchel o optimistiaeth ac entrepreneuriaeth ymysg busnesau yn yr FDSC ond fel y dangosodd yr adroddiad hefyd, y mae angen cryn dipyn o sgiliau er mwyn gyrru hyn yn ei flaen.

Casgliad ac Argymhellion

- Mae'r FDSC yn bwysig i economi Cymru, ond mae angen iddi ychwanegu mwy o werth er mwyn cystadlu â gweddill y DU. Bydd hyn yn cynnwys manteisio ar gyfleoedd a gynigir trwy ymddriniaeth cadwyn gyflenwi gyfan, gan ystyried ble mae yna sgiliau trosglwyddadwy a ble y gellir nodi mentrau ar y cyd o ran hyfforddi a datblygu busnes naill ai trwy edrych ar y ddarpariaeth bresennol neu trwy eu datblygu o'r newydd.
- Cyfrifoldeb y cynghorau SSC yw sicrhau fod y sgiliau angenrheidiol gan y gweithlu Cymreig i yrru'r FDSC yn ei blaen ac mae'r gwaith ymchwil hwn yn rhoi sylfaen tystiolaeth cadarn y gellir ei ddefnyddio er mwyn datblygu strategaethau a sicrhau'r ariannu sydd ei angen er mwyn cyflawni'r nod hwn.

O ystyried yr FDSC yn ei chyfanrwydd, mae dau brif fan lle mae yna anghenion sgiliau traws-sector:

- Lle bo sgiliau yn gyffredin i fwy nag un sector – er enghraifft, gwasanaeth i gwsmeriaid, gwerthu a masnachu neu gynllunio busnes
- Lle bo busnesau unigol wedi arallgyfeirio i sector arall ac felly wedi datblygu anghenion sgiliau ychwanegol o ganlyniad i hynny.

Ar sail casgliadau'r ymchwil a ddisgrifir yn adroddiad Prosiect Sgiliau Bwyd a Diod Cymru, awgrymir y pum argymhelliad allweddol canlynol:

1. Codi ymwybyddiaeth a datblygu dealltwriaeth o sgiliau traws-sector yn yr FDSC
 2. Codi proffil a dealltwriaeth o'r FDSC fel gyrfa bosib
 3. Datblygu gwell dealltwriaeth o hyfforddiant nad yw'n achrededig
 4. Gwella cysylltiadau rhwng addysg a diwydiant
 5. Gwella'r amodau sy'n caniatáu i fusnes traws-sector ddigwydd
