

Subject: Traffic Safety Control Officer (TSCO)

Dear Training Providers and Industry Partners

Following the routine six monthly training material review and feedback from the NHSS12 Committee, Technical authors, and industry, Lantra would like to share the latest TSCO (TSS) news.

Feedback was reviewed and assessed by appointed technical experts and the following findings were noted:

- The course content remains **unchanged** and reflects the latest industry standards and practices
 - This reflects National industry requirements to raise the level of the TSCO role and responsibilities from a Level 2+ to a Level 4

- The end of course test **content** remains **unchanged**, however following feedback a minority of these questions were restructured to enhance clarity for the learner
 - Restructured end of course test is expected to be released week commencing 28th February
 - Additionally, the test paper will also be available electronically

We would like to re-emphasise that a learner wanting to complete this training or wanting to renew their skills, to reflect the higher level required, should be aware of the fundamental principles which underpin the standards for temporary traffic management schemes and traffic signs at an engineering level and should also have participated in the planning, organisation, and supervision of traffic management schemes.

Any learners that have taken part in the new TSCO (TSS) course between the launch date in September 2021 and February 2022 who did not pass at the required standard have the option to reapply to their training provider to retake the course in full.
